On Saturday, November 4th, at the Obion County Public Library, the first quarterly VE session will be held for license testing. RARC Meeting September 28, 2006

The regular scheduled RARC meeting was called to order with 12 members and 4 visitors in attendance. After the Treasurer's report was given by Jamie WB4YDL, a special welcome was extended to Howard, W4HLR and Dave, WT8R of the Dyersburg Amateur Radio Club. Also visiting was Campbell, KD4JHI and Donald, K4DZK. To start off, Glenn N4MJ showed slides of his visit to the Ten-Tec facility in East Tennessee and showed off his new Argonaut, a Ten-Tec QRP rig. Glenn's best DX thus far is VK-land on 30 meters. On old news, the request for material items for the reconstruction of the Martin repeater has been submitted to the 'powers-that-be' in Knoxville. In their usual glacial pace, we'll find out when we find out! There will be the possibility of an additional 440 MHz repeater. Our first VE session is set for November 4th at the Obion County Public Library from 9 AM to 2 PM local. Stan W4RB is heading this up and will relay details as time approaches. Howard W4HLR talked to us about the upcoming special event station to be set up at the Reelfoot Lake camp site for National Wildlife Refuge Week 2006. His plan is to set up a portable station at his camp on October 14th and spend the night by the campfire. All are welcome to attend, visit, and setup their own station, if desired. RARC Meeting August 24, 2006

The regular scheduled RARC meeting was called to order with 14 members and one visitor in attendance. After the Treasurer's report by Jamie WB4YDL, a special welcome was extended to Donald Ray, K4DZK who was visiting the club. Don has been a long-time ham and is now getting reacquainted with 21st Century ham radio. Also in attendance was Terri KI4HIN who was up from Florida visiting her family, Dolly and Ray. A press release was submitted by Glenn N4MJ after our club's successful participation in the West TN Simulated Emergency Test held on August 12th. This was printed in the Union City Messenger on August 23rd and is linked here. This will be sent to the ARRL for consideration for published "Media Hits" in a future issue of QST. Next on the agenda was a discussion of the Martin W4UTM repeater which sustained some recent lightning damage. What is known so far is that the receiver power supply needs some repair. Lee N4ABU, along with Ottis K5BSE, will be evaluating what is needed to get this repeater back in good working order and get back to the club. Also on the horizon is the fact that the present tower on the UT-Martin campus that the repeater antennas are located is scheduled to be moved. A list of what items we require for the repeater is being requested by those constructing the new tower. Lee and Ottis, as well as Gary W4GT and Bob K9IL, will be getting this list together for the club's review. Since this is due before the next meeting, the club reflector will be used to discuss this matter. It was also pointed out that Internet Messaging could be used (MSN, Yahoo, etc.) for conferencing.

Volunteer Examination sessions will officially begin by Reelfoot Amateur Radio Club tentatively on either November 4th or 11th. Stan W4RB will be the administrator and head this up. RARC Meeting May 25, 2006

The regular scheduled RARC meeting was called to order with 11 members in attendance. The Treasurer's report was given by Jamie WB4YDL, who is recovering from recent back/spine surgery. There was no new information on the status of the WA4YGM Union City repeater upgrade. Alan KA4BNI has been unable to attend to this due to his work commitments. He is hopeful that he will soon have some spare time to work on this. Jamie WB4YDL brought in the new caps sporting club logos and about half of the prior orders were delivered. They look great! Information was passed on two items - there will be a W5YI testing session in Trenton at the EOC on June 3rd beginning at 9 AM. Also on June 3rd will be the annual Minifest at Freed Hardeman University. There will also be ARRL testing given at this minifest. Refreshments were provided by Dolly KN4SLY and were much appreciated by all. After the break, Jamie WB4YDL gave a comprehensive preview on our efforts for Field Day 2006. This year, we will attempt a somewhat 'lighter, faster' approach to deployment of antennas and vertical supports. As it stands now, there will be 7 vertical supports on which 3 of them will reside heavier items, such as yagi antennas.

Jamie went over each station with its proposed layout and equipment. Proper guying technique was emphasized as a point of safety and standard 3-point guying was reviewed. This year, we will not need to deploy one tent since we will have an RV, a '5th wheel' and a camper - all with air conditioning!! This will also make a difference in night lighting and overall comfort (read - mosquito-free). The GOTA station will again be stationed at the open pavilion. The many opportunities for obtaining bonus points were carefully reviewed. Of particular note was the rules change for the GOTA station and the opportunity to double bonus points with the assignment of a GOTA 'Coach'. Jamie WB4YDL was to deploy a significant satellite station with a dual entry into the AMSAT Field Day for the club; however, due to his recent surgery, this will be cancelled this year. It will be planned for during next year's Field Day and, with any luck, we should have a new 'bird' or two with which to communicate. Jamie also took orders for ARRL Field Day T-shirts and pins which will be presented at next month's meeting. To wrap up, Alan KA4BNI showed his pictures of his visit to the Dayton Hamvention. Some interesting shots were displayed including those of hail on the picnic table, the general layout at Hara Arena, and some of the faces and equipment seen. This concluded the meeting.

RARC Meeting April 27, 2006

The regular scheduled RARC meeting was called to order with 15 members in attendance. After the Treasurer's report, Alan KA4BNI gave the repeater report specific for the WA4YGM repeater in Union City. The new Motorola repeater with its new controller has not yet been installed due to Alan's other work commitments. It is hoped that this will be installed very soon. Alan has completed work on the Cookeville dispatch center and will be off to Chattanooga early in the morning for work to be done there. A bandpass filter was recently installed in the present repeater to allay intermodulation problems. The IRLP function has been temporarily unavailable due to an audio problem. Also, the DX cluster radio was replaced and is back up to 25 watts output. Jamie WB4YDL mentioned that the ordered caps with our logo have been shipped and are to be delivered this next week.

Harold ex-KI4HAI, is now N4HAR. Glenn N4MJ brought up the possibility of making a presentation to students at South Fulton High School next school year. It is not yet clear what format this presentation will take, but all are advised to be thinking about this very important

event. Jamie WB4YDL was asked about Field Day 2006 preparations. Things are beginning to take shape and Alan KA4BNI advised that his "fifth wheel" will be made available for this event. This was immediately pressed into service as the CW station shack! As it stands now, we will have air-conditioned environments for the phone, CW and VHF stations! The satellite station will be housed in a screen house and the GOTA station will again be positioned at the pavilion. Should there be rain, the GOTA station could quickly be repositioned at the satellite station tent. Also Jamie mentioned that bar-B-Q will be on the menu and has been pre-arranged. It was also emphasized that the low bands will be key during the bottom of the sunspot cycle. A 2-wavelength loop (~540 feet) is being planned for the CW station. The center-fed doublets will again be used on the GOTA and phone stations. Tri-band beams (read- 20 meter antenna) will again be supported on mast-towers. To wrap up the discussion, Jamie mentioned that the PR aspects will become important and account for significant bonus points as time grows close. We will need posters and flyers and GOTA station operators. This will again be a KEY station this year for bonus points.

Alan mentioned that the gentleman who was to help acquire the two Rohn 20 towers is now working for Frontier phone company in Weakley County. Alan and Bob K9IL will be talking to him in an effort to move this project along. Jeff W5VNH provided an excellent spread of food and drink and was much appreciated by all. After an intermission, Alan KA4BNI gave a very informative presentation on IRLP (Internet Repeater Linking Project), which is one of a few voice-over-internet (VoIP) formats that allows for linking of repeaters so configured, to link across the world. This allows hams with simple HT's to access a repeater and speak to another ham across the planet who is talking on a similar radio. It was brought up that Ron W9RVR was able to talk to a ham stationed at Palmer Station, Antarctica via IRLP - and this was witnessed by Jamie. This will be quite well developed in future iterations as time goes by. The meeting was adjourned after Alan's presentation.

RARC Meeting March 23, 2006

The regular scheduled RARC meeting was called to order with 9 members and one guest in attendance. Andy Lucy, KG4ZMF was welcomed from Hickman, KY. Andy is a General Class operator who later joined the club as a new member. Welcome! After the Treasurer's report,

there was some discussion about the state charter for the club and filing as a 501C3 not-for-profit organization. Jamie, WB4YDL will look into both of these items and report back at the next club meeting. There was a presentation made to a representative of the Obion County Public Library of a very nice set of ARRL books. Please see the News page of this web site for the picture that was made of this presentation. It is hoped that this will foster more interest in Amateur Radio in the community and, hopefully, new operators. The new patches with our new club logo were available and many were sold. Also see the News page for a representation of this patch. They are available for \$5 each through the club officers. There was also some conversation about a future minifest to be arranged at a future date to attract interest locally in amateur radio and just to have fun. Also there is the possibility of having a special event station (perhaps the Baptist Hospital EOC station) concurrent with the minifest. This is a new thought that will be developed at future meetings. Alan, KA4BNI was on tap to give us a presentation on IRLP, but his duties prevented this and he took a 'rain check'. He will try and make this presentation next month. We also welcomed Ray, N4SLY freshly back from triple-bypass surgery this past week. He looked great and was in good spirits. Jamie, WB4YDL and XYL June provided refreshments for the club and this was greatly appreciated and enjoyed by all. Finally, discussion of preparations for Field Day 2006 continued. This mostly revolved around estimates for fuel for the generators and antenna ideas. The low bands (40M and 80M) will be important bands for this and the next several years while the sunspots are in the tank. The 80M center-fed 'doublet' antennas will likely be changed. Suggestions for improvement are the use of full wavelength loop antennas with its requirement for extra vertical supports and the ever-popular EDZ (extended double Zepp) antenna. The latter antenna would not require any new vertical supports but would require more coax back to the 'shacks'. Instead of 1/4 wavelength on each side of the center feed, there would be 5/8 wavelength on each side. This would give about 3 dB gain but, for 80M, would be about 300 feet long. Yep, there's no free lunch! Also mentioned as the meeting adjourned was the change in GOTA rules that allow for double-double points depending on 1) mode of operation, 2) the availability of operators, and 3) the existence of a GOTA 'coach'. This is the station to concentrate on for extra points. The meeting was adjourned at this time.

RARC Meeting February 16, 2006

The regular scheduled RARC meeting was called to order with 11 members in attendance. Bob, K9IL, Vice-President was again asked to fill in for Glenn, N4MJ as he would be late to attend. Ottis Barron, K5BSE was welcomed to the club as a full member. After dues were collected, club officer elections were held. Glenn, N4MJ was again elected as President and Bob, K9IL was reelected as Vice-President. Jamie, WB4YDL was nominated and elected as Secretary-Treasurer. Congratulations to the 2006 RARC officers!

Alan, KA4BNI gave a report on the Union city repeater. A weather receiver has been acquired and will be connected to the repeater controller when it is deployed. We are awaiting the new channel elements for the new repeater which should arrive any day now. IRLP has been implemented and is functioning well. Ron, W9RVR made contact with the resident ham operator at Palmer Station Antarctica via IRLP link on the Union City WA4YGM repeater. This was witnessed by Jamie, WB4YDL, so this wasn't a 'fish tale' !! There have been a few reported DX Cluster outages that may be due to recent maintenance work performed at the site. There has been no progress on the tower take-down in Dresden. Last week, several members made their way to Jackson for the VE testing session and contributed to a very successful testing session. The WTARS folks were very gracious and our VE's learned quite a bit. This will figure prominently when we begin testing sessions here later this year. There will be a VE testing session in Trenton this next weekend on March 4th at 9AM. This is a W5YI testing session and VE's Jamie WB4YDL and Glenn N4MJ will be attending and monitoring. Also that same weekend, will be the Memphis Minifest held on the grounds of Memphis Amateur Supply in Memphis, TN.

Ron, W9RVR presented a prototype of a club membership card which he designed with our club logo with his name and callsign. This was laminated and attached to a lanyard - very nice. These can be combined with a copy of the member's amateur license in one laminated card. The Field Day 2006 committee was formed consisting of Jamie WB4YDL, Bob K9IL, and Glenn N4MJ. This was a successful group last year, but it is pointed out that any club member may certainly contribute ideas and material towards another successful Field Day. Jamie, WB4YDL pointed out briefly the rule changes for this year as relates to the GOTA (Get on the Air) station and the possibility of substantial "double-bonus" points with the addition of a GOTA Coach. More information and detail will be discussed at future meetings. Larry Vernon of Ad-Pro came to the meeting to present ideas for club caps. Several samples were passed around and a consensus approved of a Flex-band khaki cap and a 5-panel khaki cap, both to be embroidered with our club

logo. Some adjustment will have to be made to the logo in order to fit and show properly on the caps and Ron, W9RVR will head this up.

RARC Meeting January 19, 2006

The first regular meeting of the year 2006 was attended by 15 members. Bob, K9IL, Vice-President called the meeting to order. Alan, KA4BNI was asked to give an update on the Union City WA4YGM 146.700 repeater. There were recent reports, primarily by those hams in Jackson, that the repeater was not receiving as well as it had in the past. Upon inspection it was discovered that several units were sharing the received signal through a signal splitter causing signal degradation. Additional preamps will be inserted in an effort to rectify this problem. As recently reported on the RARC reflector, the GE repeater will be replaced by a new Motorola MSR 2000 unit. This will make it much easier to interface and link to things such as the weather service. An exciting upcoming addition will be IRLP which is a VoIP technology that will allow linking of radio repeaters via the internet. Vacationing RARC members could successfully check into the Sunday evening net by simply accessing an IRLP repeater in that area and link to the Union City repeater. Neat! The KN4F DX cluster radio recently sustained a failure and will be quickly replaced. The failed radio will be repaired and held in reserve. The new Paris DX cluster has agreed to accept a change in frequencies for its operation. The previous frequency was the same as KN4F's and was feared that it would cause mutual interference. The Martin W4UTM repeater is presently not functioning - no audio is output. Ala, KA4BNI has agreed to give a presentation on IRLP at the March meeting. Don't miss it!!

The next meeting in February will be the election of club officers and the collection of membership dues. Be thinking of the former and don't forget the latter! Presently, the savings account is classified as dormant. This will be corrected by a shift in funds. Jamie, WB4YDL gave a report on the Baptist Hospital EOC station. It was found that the station was left in the 'power on' position. Personnel at the facility were reminded that only authorized and licensed hams could operate the station. Jamie did take the opportunity to mention that training will soon be offered. It is hoped that a better operating position with counter and storage shelves will be constructed soon at this facility. Rose is now sporting a new call sign - W9DHD. Congratulations, Rose!

As previously announced on the RARC reflector, Glenn, N4MJ announced that Reelfoot Amateur Radio Club has been designated a Special Services Club (SSC) by the ARRL! These are clubs that go the extra mile in providing on-going training and support for benefit of their community. Glenn also brought up the ARRL book set that is offered for \$200. Over time, plans are to donate this set of books to the area libraries and schools. A motion was made and seconded to purchase this set of books for donation to the Obion County Public Library using available checking account funds. This motion was approved by acclimation. Also mentioned was Randy McCloy, KC8VKZ who was the sole survivor of the January 2 Sago mine disaster in West Virginia. Well-wishers and fellow hams are encouraged to send cards and QSL's to PO Box 223, Philippi, WV 26435.

Larry Vernon of Ad Pro presented samples of items and discussed pricing for setup of the club logo. Through extended discussion it was decided to proceed with initial proofing of the patch image on paper pending final artwork approval by the available membership. Ron, W9RVR will be distributing this image. It is anticipated that the club will begin with patches and the digitalization of a logo for embroidery on such things as caps and shirts. Prices and numbers of colors were discussed and it is anticipated that the final final decision will be made at next month's meeting. This concluded the January 2006 meeting.
