It was Chris KI4TRM who was able to contact several operators in Obion, Weakley, and Dyer Counties to begin emergency communications. During that time, there was no way to get a message to Frankfurt, KY for urgent requests of aid until Ron W9RVR was able to cross-band repeat Chris' 2M signal to the 75M KY emergency frequency. This finally got the ball rolling and soon Hickman was receiving the urgent supplies that they needed. For these actions, Chris KI4TRM and Ron W9RVR were presented Certificates of Appreciation from Mr's Caldwell and Atwill. Congratulations, Ron and Chris!

After the Treasurer's report was given by Jamie WB4YDL, old news from the previous meeting was reviewed. The field trip to Obion County 911 was enjoyed greatly by all that attended. The Technician Class license course is well attended with 13 students. A VE testing session will be

offered immediately at the conclusion of this course.

Officer elections were held and by acclimation, all present officers were re-elected. Congratulations, officers! The first of two readings of a change to the RARC By-Laws to account for assets of the club in the event of dissolution was read. After this change is incorporated in the By-Laws, it will allow RARC to become incorporated under subchapter 501c3 which governs non-profit organizations. The first reading was accepted as read.

The Obion County Library display scheduled for the months of May and June of this year will have an emergency communications theme, according to director Rose W9DHD. There were lots of ideas offered and certainly our Field Day efforts will be part of this display.
